In connection with the National Science Day (2023) Celebration, the PG Department of Physics organized an **Intercollegiate Physics Meet "SCIFEST-2023"** in a grand manner to commemorate the discovery of Raman Effect by the Nobel laureate Sir C. V. Raman. The inaugural function of the Meet commenced with Tamil Thaaai Vazhthu at 10.00 a.m. **Dr. S. Ramaswamy, Head, PG Department of Physics** welcomed the gathering and **Dr. P. Kavitha, Principal (i/c)** presided over the function. The guest of honor, **Mr. M. Vijayaragavan, Secretary, Mannar Thirumalai Naicker College**, felicitated the gathering by quoting, "Learning is the first and foremost thing." He encourages the participants to flourish in the Physics stream with clear cut knowledge and strong determination. The aim of the programme is to ignite the enthusiastic minds of students.
